21	amendment for the Trinity Gateway Plan. We are in							
22	the process of attempting to buy from the Rhode							
23	Island D.O.T., a parcel of land on Maple and							
24	Friendship. The property in question is in a							

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National Historic District. The Rhode Island D.O.T. requirements are that we must submit plans as to what we propose to use the property for before they will sell the parcel to us. However, as is typical for redevelopment agency plans, we have no proposed plan at this time. We want to acquire the property and market it for use in conformance with Redevelopment. So we have reached a compromise with the Rhode Island Department of Transportation and the Rhode Island Historical Preservation Commission, whereby if we amend the redevelopment plan and state that any development of this parcel must be approved by the Local Historic District Commission, that they will waive the requirements and sell the property to us.

So we're just seeking amendment to the ordinance that will allow the Local Historic District Commission to review any use of this property prior to the sale to any future owner. And that's the only change before you this evening.
