The Committee on Finance meets this day at 4:00 o'clock P.M. in Committee Room "A", City Clerk's Department, City Hall.

Present: Chairwoman Brassil, Councilmen Dillon and Glavin, and Councilwoman Fagnoli.

REQUEST OF MAYOR PAOLINO THAT JOSEPH AGOSTINELLI BE GRANTED AN EXEMPTION FROM THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 1990.

Chairwoman Brassil reads a communication from Mayor Paolino dated August 3, 1989, requesting a limited exemption from the City Charter's residency requirement for Joseph Agostinelli to serve as Special Assistant until December 31, 1990.

He has served as Interim Director of three departments and presently as interim Tax Collector.

Mayor Paolino states he has conducted a diligent search and has been unable to find anyone currently residing in Providence who possess^{es} the background to serve as Special Assistant.

Discussion ensues relative to the request, the communication is received and the matter will be placed on the next City Council Docket from the Administration.

REQUEST FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE OF ROBERT M. ENRIGHT EMPLOYED IN THE WATER SUPPLY BOARD.

Chairwoman Brassil states an error in dates was submitted on the Request of Robert M. Enright, employed in the Water Supply Board for his leave of absence to attend the Police Training Academy.

The dates previously submitted started July 10, 1989 through November 20, 1989.

On motion of Councilman Dillon, seconded by Councilwoman Fagnoli, the amended request of Robert M. Enright for Leave of Absence is Approved.


RELATIVE TO AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH BONDS AUTHORIZED BY ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE TWENTY-FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$25,000,000.00) AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF NOT IN EXCESS OF TWENTY-FIVE MILLION DOLLAR (\$25,000,000.00) GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR RENOVATIONS TO SCHOOLS" MAY BE ISSUED.

Chairwoman Brassil states the foregoing Ordinance was passed a First Time by the City Council on July 13, 1989 and Referred to Committee on Finance.

It is extending the time for borrowing in accordance with the Charter.

On motion of Councilman Glavin, seconded by Councilwoman Fargnoli, it is voted to approve the Ordinance and transmit same to the City Council with recommendation of Adoption a Second Time.
