Mr. Moran outlines the following Ordinances:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND (\$27,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR POLICE DEPARTMENT, ITEMS 1 AND 2. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

The sum of \$27,000.00 is appropriated for Police Department and is apportioned as follows: Item I, \$17,000.00 and Item II, \$10,000.00. The amount in Item I is for added cost of telephone service, repairs to automobiles and repairs to buildings. Item II is for gasoline, tires, janitor's supplies and plumbing and electrical repair parts. The entire amount of \$27,000.00 is transferred from Police Department, Item "0".

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TWENTY-ONE THOUSAND (\$21,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT, ITEMS 1 AND 2. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

\$21,000.00 is appropriated for Fire Department and is apportioned as follows: Item I, \$9,000.00 and Item II, \$12,000.00.

The amount in Item I is for building repairs, auto repairs, telephone, laundry and repairs to plant equipment. Item II is for janitor supplies, auto parts, plumbing and electrical repair parts, lumber, gasoline and paint. The entire sum of \$21,000.00 is transferred from Police Department. Item 0.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF SIXTEEN THOUSAND (\$16,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR JUNIOR POLICE CAMP, item 3. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

\$16,000.00 is appropriated for Junior Police Camp for the operation of the camp during the summer and this sum is obtained from the increased revenue from Property Taxes-Current Year.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY TRANSFERRING THE SUM OF NINE THOUSAND (\$9,000) DOLLARS TO SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

\$9,000.00 is transferred from Street Lighting to various Public Works Divisions as follows: \$1200.00 for Sidewalks and Curbing,

Item O to provide salary of Clerk-Typist added to payroll in November. No provision was made for salary at that time. \$1500.00 for Sidewalks and Curbing, Item II, to purchase street signs.

\$2,000.00 for Sewage Disposal, Item I for repairs to Dorr Clarifiers.

\$500.00 for Sewer Maintenance, Item I, for added telephone costs and repairs to autos and trucks. \$2,000.00 for Sewer Maintenance,

Item II for the purchase of material to repair sewers in conjunction with the stepped-up highway repairing program and repair parts for Eductors. \$600.00 for Municipal Dock, Item I to purchase railroad ties to repair trackage. \$1200.00 for Municipal Dock,

Item O for added compensation made necessary by repair work.

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AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 55 OF CHAPTER 129, APPROVED SEPTEMBER 3, 1948, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE CLASSES OF POSITIONS, THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES AND THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES IN CERTAIN CLASSES IN CITY DEPARTMENTS, ETC. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

This Ordinance amends Section 55 of Chapter 129 by adding three Recreation Center Directors, one for Plain Street Recreation Center and one for each Swimming Pool.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 129 SECTION 63-A OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE AS APPROVED SEPTEMBER 3, 1948. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

This Ordinance amends Section 63-A, Chapter 129, Traffic Engineering Department by deleting one Engineering Aide III and adding one Traffic Field Investigator as requested by Mr. Myers.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$295,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR G.P.A. UNALLOCATED. ITEMS 1 AND 3. (In city Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

The sum of \$295,000.00 is added to the appropriation for G.P.A. Unallocated, Items I and III, and apportioned as follows:

Item I, \$25,000.00; Item III, \$270,000.00 and is obtained by transferring \$20,000.00 from G.P.A. Unallocated, Item II and the estimated receipts are increased as follows: Grants-In-Aid (State of Rhode Island), General Public Assistance, \$192,500.00, and Property Taxes, Current Year, \$82,500.00. This appropriation is necessary to cover

increased cost of hospitalization and home relief grants.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF FOUR THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND FIFTY (\$4,650) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR BOARD OF CANVASSERS AND REGISTRATION, ITEMS O AND 1. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

The sum of \$1750.00 appropriated to Board of Canvassers,

Item O to cover the added costs of temporary employees during the last election period. \$2900.00 to cover the added costs of printing and rental of new I.B.M. equipment. The money is obtained from increased revenue from Property Taxes-Current Year.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TWENTY-FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR WELFARE ADMINISTRATION, ITEM 5. (In City Council June 2, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

\$2500.00 is appropriated to Welfare Administration, Item 5 to purchase truck and is obtained by transferring \$1,000.00 from Welfare Administration, Item 0 and \$1,500.00 from G.P.A. Administration, Item 0.

On motion of Mr. Presel, seconded by Mr. Laudati, it is voted to return the nine foregoing Ordinances to the City Council with recommendation of passage a second time.
