April 14, 1947.

The Committee on Finance meets this day at 12:00 o'clock Noon. Present: Chairman Mariani and Messrs. Moakler and Laudati. Budget Director Reynolds and City Controller Keegan are also present. (James J. Kelly, Assistant Clerk).

At the request of Chairman Mariani, Budget Director Reynolds explains the following Ordinances:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 1513 OF 1946 BY ADDING THE SUM OF FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED (\$4,500) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION FOR GENERAL PARKS - ITEM 2. (In City Council April 3, 1947. Read and passed the first time.)

This Ordinance provides for the purchase of loam for the various parks in the city. It is estimated the increased income from the Municipal Golf Course will be \$4,500.00 and this will be sufficient to take care of the cost of the loam.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 1513 OF 1946, BY ADDING THE SUM OF FORTY THOUSAND (\$40,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION FOR CHAPIN HOSPITAL - ITEM 2. (In City Council April 3, 1947. Read and passed the first time.)

Due to the tremendous increase in the cost of food and pharmaceuticals at the Chapin Hospital, it has been necessary to allocate the sum of \$40,000.00 to take care of the additional cost. No additional appropriation is necessary because the collections for services rendered at the hospital are much greater than anticipated.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 1513 OF 1946 BY ADDING THE SUM OF SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY FIVE (\$725) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION FOR POLICE COURT - ITEM 0. (In City Council April 3, 1947. Read and passed the first time.)

A short time ago an extra clerk was added to the Police Court and this \$725.00 is to meet the sum remaining in the salary item for the balance of the fiscal year, and it is estimated the increased income from fines, forfeits and escheats will take care of this appropriation.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 1513 OF 1946, BY ADDING THE SUM OF FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED (\$4,500) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC PLAYGROUNDS - ITEM 1. (In City Council April 3, 1947. Read and passed the first time.)

The East Street School is being made over as a recreation center and this is to provide for the installation of shower and toilet facilities and to build a fence around the school yard. The estimated increased income from the Municipal Golf Course will take care of this appropriation.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1209, ESTABLISHING A CLASSIFICATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE. (In City Council April 3, 1947. Read and passed the first time.)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1510 ESTABLISHING A COMPENSATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, AS APPROVED SEPTEMBER 6, 1946. (In City Council April 3, 1947. Read and passed the first time.)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1509, SECTION 53 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE AS APPROVED SEPTEMBER 6, 1946. (In City Council April 3, 1947.)

These three Ordinances deal with the Recreation Center Director establishing a Classification Plan, Compensation Plan of \$2,500.00 per year and adds two Recreation Center Directors in the Classification, Board of Recreation-Playgrounds, increasing the personnel allowed from 237 to 239.

On motion of Mr. Laudati, seconded by Mr. Moakler, it is voted to return the seven foregoing Ordinances to the City Council at its next meeting with recommendation of passage a second time.


