The Committee on Urban Redevelopment, Renewal and Planning meets this day Upon the Rise of the 6:00 o'clock P.M. Public Hearing, in Committee Room "A", Third Floor, City Clerk's Department, City Hall.

PRESENT: Chairwoman Balbina A. Young, Vice-Chairman Miguel C. Luna and Councilwoman Carol A. Romano – 3.

ABSENT: Councilman Joseph DeLuca and Councilman David A. Segal – 2.

Also present are Councilman Terrence M. Hassett; Lincoln Lennon, Assistant City Solicitor, Law Department; John Ozbek, Department of Planning and Development; Mimi Budnick, DARE; Anna M. Stetson, Second Deputy City Clerk and Lori L. Hagen Assistant Clerk.

**An Ordinance in Amendment of and in Addition to Chapter 1986-53 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence Approved October 23, 1986 and Entitled: "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Special Vacant Lot Project" for the Acquisition of Lots 2, 73, & 763, Plat 23, 10, 2, & 6 Hayward Street, Respectively.**

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: We have only what, five items – or six, Six items and the first one is the one we just heard in the public hearing. This is the ordinance for the special vacant lot project for 10, 2 and six Hayward Street. We just want to enter into the record a letter by one of the DARE organizers, Mimi Budnick, who could not make the public hearing, and asked this be included into the record, and I'll just kind of read a little bit of it. It says, "My name is Mimi Budnick and I am a community organizer at DARE, Direct Action for Rights and Equality. DARE is located on the corner of Lockwood and Hayward Street, directly across from the lot and property in question. Both the lot and building are in plain site outside the window of my office. In the first year of my employment

at DARE it quickly became clear to me that both of these sites were in dire neglect, and were wasted resources that had the potential to be put to good use for the community. I tried to no avail to contact the owner listed for the vacant lot. The address listed for him was a vacant building. Although I left numerous notes there, I failed to get any response from him. Over the past few years members of DARE and the surrounding community have taken matters into our own hands, after all it is us, no the owner that have had to put up with the garbage, broken glass, rats and needles. Despite the owners neglect, we have transformed the lot into a productive garden and green space, keeping it clean and well maintained.

Although we have invested considerable resources and energy into transforming the lot, we have always been hesitant because we do not have ownership of the property. I urge the City Council to take action on this property, and to take it out of the hand of its neglectful owner, and place it in the hands of the community to develop as a positive resource. Furthermore, I urge the City Council to allocate and preserve this space as green, open space and/or recreational space. Many of the vacant lots on the Southside have recently been converted to housing. While affordable housing is undoubtedly a major need in our community, there is also a severe shortage of open space and recreational areas. Open spaces greatly improve the quality of life of neighborhood residents and provide children with a safe place to gather. I hope the City Council will strongly consider my statement and commit to including DARE and community residents in any further discussions about the use of the lot and property at Hayward and Lockwood. Thank you". Thank you, Mimi and we'll put that into the record.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: I have a question.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Yes.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Are those clean sites, those – those lots?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: One has a house on them and two are vacant right, John?

MR. OZBEK: That's right.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Because I know that there was one right behind DARE that they did some test on. I know that's not the one --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: No, this is across the street, yeah.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: But they found a lot of stuff on it.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Um-hum.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: But I was just wondering if that's something that --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: We don't know. No one has done any testing.

MR. OZBEK: We haven't done any -- we know -- I know that --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Mimi knows.

MS. BUDNICK: I actually do know. The owner of the lot -- they're different owners. The owner of the lot on the corner opposite of DARE, I think it's Two Hayward, that site Southside Community Land trust and ourselves actually ran the soil tests on through the university of Massachusetts, and that lot has safe lead levels.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay.

MS. BUDNICK: There's a different owner of the lots that are behind DARE that Cleanscape has been doing maintenance on.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Right.

MS. BUDNICK: And that owner actually offered to give DARE those properties about five years back, and DARE's interest in those properties at that point was to convert them to --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: -- a playground.

MS. BUDNICK: -- a tot lot and a playground.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: I remember.

MS. BUDNICK: And the lead levels on those lots were so astronomical --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: They never followed through, right.

MS. BUDNICK: -- that we turned down the offer. So, we never --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: But six and ten though I think they're owned by another person, right?

MR. OZBEK: Six and ten -- six has a house on it.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Six has a house on it, right.

MS. OZBEK: And ten it doesn't look like a separate lot but there's a small -- a very small lot next to it.

MS. BUDNICK: Yeah, yeah.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: And so we don't know about that other lot.

MS. BUDNICK: Yeah, I don't know about those.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: But we know about the lot that they've had the flower garden and the garden on.

MS. BUDNICK: I do know that both the ten and the lots on the other side, I don't know what the numbers of those are, there was a parking lot that was made by Jovan's and whoever the contractors were that paved that lot dumped tons of excess tar and rubble into all those spaces. So, they should also be held responsible for the clean up of those lots because as far as making a viable garden or -- there's a considerable amount of clean up that's going to have to be done on all those lots.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: This is the one in back of DARE.

MR. OZBEK: That's at Hayward -- Hayward and Pearl, the fence -- with the very high fence around it?

MS. BUDNICK: That's the lot that got paved.

MR. OZBEK: The parking lot.

MS. BUDNICK: And everything got dumped in all the other lots.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: All the other vacant lots.

MS. BUDNICK: Yeah.

MS. OZBEK: We can try to track that down. Good information.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay, thank you. Does that answer your question?

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Yeah.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay. So, again this is – we're moving on. I'm asking for a motion to approve this item. Councilwoman, this is in my ward and I do support it.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: I make a motion.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Second the motion. I was just going to ask that.

On motion of Vice-Chairman Luna, Seconded by Councilwoman Romano, it is voted to approve the foregoing matter.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Motion has been made and seconded to approve, all those in favor.

COMMITTEE: Ayes.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Opposed? Motion carries. The item's approved. Congratulations.

MS. BUDNICK: Thank you very much.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: You got it approved, okay. And we'll be working on the money to acquire the property now.

MS. BUDNICK: All right. Well, contact us and we'll work with you.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: We're glad to be doing that, yeah. Thanks.

MR. OZBEK: He supports it.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Second.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Item number three is the special vacant lot project for the acquisition of lots 371 and 384 on plat 62, which is 39 Julian Street and 31-33 Julian Street.

MR. OZBEK: The 15<sup>th</sup> ward.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: That's Councilwoman DiRuzzo. She requested that we approve that.

**Resolution Requesting the Board of Contract and Supply to authorize  
the purchase of Assessor's Plat 64, Lot 653 (280 Academy Avenue),  
within the Special Vacant Lot Project from the Providence  
Redevelopment Agency for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to be  
transferred to the Parks Department and also to cause any and all taxes  
to be abated, in whole, including 2002 taxes.**

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: This is a resolution requesting the Board of  
Contract and Supply to authorize the purchase of Assessor's plat 64, lot 653, which  
is 280 Academy Avenue, which is also the special vacant lot project from the PRA  
for the sum of one dollar to be transferred to the Parks Department, and to cause all  
taxes to be abated in whole, including 2002 taxes. So, we have –

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Actually, Madame Chair, if I may. That's the  
– across from Citizens. That's that new –

MR. OZBEK: -- triangular park where Chalkstone and Academy –

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: And it took us millions of years to do.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Is this yours, Terry?

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: No, actually because I'm on the PRA now they – I guess they titled it to Luis and myself.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Oh, okay.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: But I've been involved with that. Councilman DeLuca is in support, too.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay. Can we get a motion to approve?

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: I make a motion.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Second the motion.

On motion of Vice-Chairman Luna, Seconded by Councilwoman Romano, it is voted to approve the foregoing matter.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Motion has been made and seconded, all those in favor.

COMMITTEE: Ayes.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Opposed? Motion carries.

**Resolution Authorizing the Providence Redevelopment Agency to initiate the condemnation of that property located at 551 Chalkstone Avenue, Assessor's Plat 69, Lot 260.**

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: This is you, Councilman Hassett.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Yes.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: What would you like us to do with this one?

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Well, I'd like you to approve it.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Motion to continue.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: She said motion to continue.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: I had to get him on that one.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Would you like it approved?

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Yeah. I just – I've just got to point out a couple of different things just for the record, Madame Chair, if I might.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Sure.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: This is on the corner of Chalkstone and Camden Avenue. This used to be the site of the old Grade A Market, which was –

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Oh, okay. Okay, yeah.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: -- eventually torn down in 1994 I think it was. It's \$25,000.00 in back taxes. That's just the tax. It doesn't include the penalties and interest. It's on the tax reverted list.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Um-hum.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: And we clean it – DPW that is, on behalf of the City, we clean it twice a year. It's sitting there doing nothing. It's in a prominent location that we believe is within the proximity of the – the Smith Street corridor, we're trying to bring life to and improve there. So, it's the only way to go. There seems to be no movement by the owner on this property. It – hasn't paid taxes in the last eight years.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Um-hum.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: So, it – fortunately it's on the tax reverted list but I think the best way to do it, the most efficient way to do it is for the PRA to take control over it, let's get a developer, let's get it back on the tax rolls and provide some neighborhood services, as we all know we're got to do some times.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Absolutely. Okay. No problem.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: So, that's – that's all.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Thank you, Councilman. Can we get a motion to approve?

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Motion to approve.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Second.

On motion of Councilwoman Romano, Seconded by Vice-Chairman Luna, it is voted to approve the foregoing matter.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Motion has been made and seconded, all those in favor.

COMMITTEE: Ayes.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Opposed? Motion carries.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Thank you, Madame Chair.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Thank you.

**Resolution Renaming that street currently named “American Express Way” to “Financial Way” so as to establish a permanent reflection of businesses located along the street.**

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: The last one is the resolution – this has been around so long. You might want to stay here. This is the resolution re-naming the street currently named American Express Way to Financial Way.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: You know they referred to it in the paper, Madame Chair, this morning as Financial Way.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: But it’s not.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: It’s not.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: It’s not.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: I don’t – is the sign up?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: No – this has never been approved.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: That’s what I mean. But I think – is there a sign up there?

MR. OZBEK: I haven’t seen it.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: I could have sworn, unless I was dreaming.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: If there is one up we’ll have to instruct Public Works Department to go take it down. That is illegal. It’s still – but the Post Office has objection to this. They continued to object.

MS. STETSON: Yes, they did. Sam was coming in tonight, so I thought, with a – a resolution in regard to this. He said he –

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: I thought so, too.

MS. STETSON: He was going to discuss this.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: That's why we put it on here --

MS. STETSON: Yeah.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: -- to resolve this because this has been around for a while. And very rarely does the Post Office complain and object to something.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Do we know why they --

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: What is the complaint?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Their objection --

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: It's item six in there.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Yeah, look in your packet.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: That first page, Miguel, Councilman.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: They say, "we strongly oppose this proposed change and foresee many problems associated with it".

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Yes. What they're saying -- they want to change it back to Park Row West, right. Isn't that what they said, to Park Row without using the east or west. See, their -- that's what the original name used to be.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: I think what the Post Office is concerned with, and it should be a concern, every time some building changes hands, when Fleet merged with BankBoston, they want BankBoston Plaza.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Exactly.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: So, every time it suits the tenant, we shouldn't be changing these street names based on that.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: No, we really shouldn't be.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Unless you make a huge investment, and you're going to be there, and that's the name of the street, and that's the end of it.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Well, that's what they're saying. They're recommending that we return this to its original name, and that was the designation there was – there was currently a One Park Row.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Which, you know what, I think makes sense.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: You see this letter, this was a letter that they said there was a request to make it Park Row East and then a Park Row West. They're just saying change it back to Park Row.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Who's saying that?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: The Post Office, without using the east or west

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Is that the first letter?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: -- designation. But – it's in the packet of item number six, the last letter.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Oh, it's the last letter.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: The last letter from the Postmaster.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Oh, because there's a letter on the first one.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: It's dated August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2002.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: So, that's after the March letter.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Yeah.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Okay.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: And we have lots of letters on this one. So, you don't know what Sam –

MS. STETSON: I do know that –

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: -- do we want to continue this to find out what Sam was recommending because I – I'm considering –

MS. STETSON: I want to say that it was Park Row West, but again, he was coming – he said that he would bring a resolution in and he would clear this up.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: So, Sam's saying go back to Park Row West.

MS. STETSON: That's what I believe.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Which is what the original --

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: You know what, I -- I mean --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: That's your area.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: -- as the sponsor, I mean the thing is it makes sense that way there we're not really for or against anybody. Like Park Row West and that's the end of it. I mean every time somebody moves in you're changing the name.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Exactly.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: And you get sucked in and you say, we'll try it, we'll introduce it. You try to be accommodating but, you know, we're up there changing signs, you know, like --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: It's crazy. This one's crazy, yeah.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Yeah, I mean it's like Jake Kaplan's Way and then now --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: But, you know, you can do that.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: And it'll be there forever.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: But Jake bought the street though. He bought part of that street. That street --

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: He did?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Yes, he did. He bought that.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: I thought it was given to him.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: No.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: He --

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: No, no, no. It wasn't given to him. No, no. He bought that street and there's official record where he bought that part of the street and that was area -- was blocked off but he bought the area. So, he owned that street. So, that's why we named it after Jake. Let me just -- because that was in

my ward and I can tell you why it was done but he bought part of that street. They abandoned that part of the street and he bought it.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: And you can see like if it was like a circle and the only building that's there is like a big company that made a huge investment, then you would pay that courtesy.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Um-hum.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: But I think we're getting – I don't know. I'm getting sucked into the same thing so.

MR. OZBEK: Madame Chair, I'd be happy to get some kind of resolution from our office if it's possible but if you want to just –

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: You can amend this from American Express Plaza and just get rid of this thing. You know, it's up to the Committee so.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: I mean they can if they want to look at some commemorative names where we can give it like dual designation where the official street is Park Row West and then it can be called Financial Way. They've done that in other places. It's like commutative names.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Malcolm X Way.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Huh?

MR. OZBEK: Malcolm X Boulevard.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Malcolm X Boulevard.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Exactly. We can call it that, too.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Well, I can tell you as a former mailman, when I was in college and spent two summers, just the lack of street signs in the City is –

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: It makes it crazy, yeah.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: And that's back then. That's going back, you know, years.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: And the Post Office has been always very, very considerate, and very willing to work with us. So, when they really say they strongly object to this, I think we have to listen to them. So, you want –

MR. OZBEK: Park Row?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Park Row. It was really Park Row West, wasn't it, the original name?

MS. STETSON: I think so.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Originally, yeah.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Madame Chair, do you want to go back? Do you want to just amend the resolution to go back to what it originally was?

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Which is Park Row West.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Make a bold statement and then that's the end of it.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: I think so.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: That way we can get rid of it.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: It's your ward. Do you want to make the call?

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Yeah, I mean –

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: -- I don't want to take up the time of the Committee. This – this has come back over and over again.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: More than it should have, yes.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Yeah, really. We're paying too much time on something like this.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: All right. So, then what we want to do at this point in time – do we have to have another – no, we can just –

ASSISTANT CITY SOLICITOR LENNON: You can amend it here in the Committee.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay.

ASSISTANT CITY SOLICITOR LENNON: You need – you know, you need to have a motion to amend.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay. Can I get a motion to amend item number six, to amend this instead of American Express Way it will be Park Row West, its original name.

COUNCILMAN HASSETT: Shall herein be designated park Row West.

COUNCILMAN ROMANO: Yeah.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Right.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: I make a motion.

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: Second the motion.

On motion of Vice-Chairman Luna, Seconded by Councilwoman Romano, it is voted to amend the foregoing matter to read the change American Express Way to Park Row West.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Motion has been made to amend, all those in favor.

COMMITTEE: Ayes.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Opposed? We're going to amend this. And now we can – we're going to vote on this as amended. Can I get a motion?

COUNCILWOMAN ROMANO: So moved.

VICE-CHAIRMAN LUNA: Second.

On motion of Councilwoman Romano, Seconded by Vice-Chairman Luna, it is voted to approve the foregoing matter, as amended.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Motion has been made and seconded, all those in favor.

COMMITTEE: Ayes.

CHAIRWOMAN YOUNG: Okay, it is passed now so it's going to be Park Row West, back to what it originally was. Thank you so much.
