The Committee on Finance meets this day at 12:00 o'clock Noon. Present: Messrs. Laudati, Moakler and Lazarus. Finance Director Reynolds is also present by invitation. (James J. Kelly, Assistant Clerk)

The Clerk informs the Committee that Chairman Mariani is unable to be present and nominations are in order for the Acting Chairmanship of this Committee.

Mr. Laudati nominates Mr. Moakler and this nomination is seconded by Mr. Lazarus.

There being no counter nominations, the Clerk declares the nominations closed and Mr. Moakler elected Acting Chairman of this Committee.

ACTING CHAIRMAN MOAKLER IN THE CHAIR

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1209, ESTABLISHING A CLASSIFICATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

This Ordinance amends Chapter 1209 by revising, deleting and adding several specifications in the Classification Plan as requested by the Redevelopment Agency.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF EIGHTY THOUSAND (\$80,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR G.P.A. UNALLOCATED, ITEM 3. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

The sum of \$80,000.00 is appropriated to G.P.A. Unallocated, Item 3, to cover the increased cost of relief to September 30th. This sum is obtained by a transfer of \$24,000.00 from Chapin Hospital, Item 0 and Increased Estimated Receipts from Grants-In-Aid (State of Rhode Island,) General Public Assistance, by \$56,000.00.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TEN THOUSAND (\$10,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR CHAPIN HOSPITAL, ITEM 2. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

\$10,000.00 is appropriated to Chapin Hospital, Item 2, to cover increased cost of drugs and pharmaceuticals and is obtained by transferring \$3,000.00 from Chapin Hospital, Item 0 and \$7,000.00 from Chapin Hospital, Item 5.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY DECREASING SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT BY THE SUM OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-TWO DOLLARS AND EIGHTY-SEVEN CENTS (\$35,952.87). (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

This Ordinance decreases the appropriation of the City Collector, Item 0, by \$8,000.00, Assessor's Division, Item 1 by \$3,000.00 and North Burial Ground Building Account by \$24,952.87, and the Estimated Revenue from Horse Racing Receipts is decreased by a similar amount.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF FOUR THOUSAND (\$4,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR HIGHWAY DIVISION, ITEM 2. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

To purchase materials needed in conjunction with the Highway Resurfacing Program, \$4,000.00 is appropriated for Highway Division, Item 2, and is obtained by transferring a like amount from Highway, Item 0.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND (\$2,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR SEWER MAINTENANCE, ITEM 2. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

The sum of \$2,000.00 is appropriated for Sewer Maintenance, Item 2, also in conjunction with the Highway Program and is obtained by transferring \$2,000.00 from Sewer Maintenance, Item 0.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000.00) TO THE APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL ESTATES REVOLVING FUND. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

A \$25,000.00 Public School Estates Revolving Fund is established at the beginning of each fiscal year which takes care of financing salaries, wages and all other expenses on account of repairs to school buildings made by the Superintendent of Public Buildings at the request of the School Committee.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF CHAPTER 55 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF 1914 ENTITLED "SALARIES" AND THE ORDINANCES IN AMENDMENT THEREOF RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE NORTH BURIAL GROUND AND HIS ASSISTANTS. (In City Council September 1, 1949. Read and passed the first time)

This Ordinance increases the salary of the Superintendent of North Burial Ground from \$3,500 to \$3,850 in addition to house and garden rent; that of the Chief Clerk from \$2,314 to \$2,545 and that of the Clerk from \$1,430 to \$1,573 annually. These employees are under the jurisdiction of the Park Commissioners and are not included in the regular Classification or Compensation Plan which applies to the majority of employees.

On motion of Mr. Laudati, seconded by Mr. Lazarus, it is voted to return the eight foregoing Ordinances to the City Council with recommendation of passage a second time.

REQUEST OF THE CITY TREASURER FOR RENEWAL OF NOTE DUE SEPTEMBER 16, 1949.


