The Committee on Finance meets this day at 12:00 o'clock Noon. Present: Chairman Mariani and Messrs. Laudati, Presel, and Lazarus. Budget Officer Moran and City Solicitor McCabe are also present. (James J. Kelly, Assistant Clerk).

Mr. Moran outlines the following Ordinances:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TEN THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE (\$10,665) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR POLICE DEPARTMENT-ITEM 2. (In City Council March 3, 1949. Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance).

The sum of Ten Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty-five (\$10,665) Dollars is appropriated to the Police Department, Item 2, for the Police Uniform Account. In the Budget, the sum of \$4,200.00 was allocated but due to the increased number of men who are drawing on the Uniform Account, this appropriation is made for the balance of the fiscal year.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF FIFTY-SEVEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY (\$57,130) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION - ITEMS 0, 1, 2 and 5. (In City Council March 3, 1949. Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance).

The sum of \$57,130.00 appropriated to Department of Recreation is apportioned as follows: Item 0 - \$22,000; Item 1 - \$5,500; Item 2 - \$19,850; Item 5 - \$9,780, and to be expended as follows: \$30,000 for operating swimming pools; \$15,850 for loam and supplies for playgrounds; \$9,780 for replacing some of the swings and slides and also to purchase cement mixer and gang mower, and \$1500 to install sprinkle type sprays in nineteen wading pools. The City Controller and the City Treasurer are authorized to transfer \$21,725.42 from the Reserved for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account and the estimated receipts are increased as follows: Department of Recreation - \$15,000.00; Property Tax-Current Year- \$20,404.58; Extraordinary Expenditures - \$21,725.42.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128 BY ADDING THE SUM OF ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR JUNIOR POLICE CAMP - ITEM 6. (In City Council March 3, 1949. Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance).

This Ordinance adds \$1,000 for Junior Police Camp, Item 6 for the purchase of ten buildings at \$100.00 each from the Federal Government at Fort Green, Point Judith, the present site of the Junior Police Camp. The land is leased from the Government at a cost of \$200 per year.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 129, SECTIONS 13, 21, 22, 26, 29 and 63-A OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE AS APPROVED SEPTEMBER 3, 1948. (In City Council March 3, 1949. (Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance).

Sec. 26-Police Department - Parking Meter Division. One Chief Parking Meter Mechanic and two Parking Meter Maintenance Men are transferred to the Traffic Engineering Department and three Parking Meter Coin Collector and two Parking Meter Coin Counter are transferred to the City Collector.

Sec. 21-Police Department. There is deleted One Maintenance Man II and one Superintendent of Signals (Police).

Sec. 63-A - Traffic Engineering Department. There is added to this Classification, one Chief Parking Meter Mechanic and two Parking Meter Maintenance Man transferred from Police Department - Parking Meter Division. There is also added one Maintenance Man II and one Superintendent of Signals (Police), transferred from the Police Department.

Sec. 22 - Fire Department. There is added two Maintenance Man II transferred from Police Department.

Sec. 13 - City Collector. This adds three Parking Meter Coin Collector and two Meter Coin Counter, the same being transferred from the Police Department-Parking Meter Division. The City Collector's Office will handle all monies collected from Parking Meters and these five employees will be under the jurisdiction of the City Collector instead of the Police Department. All these changes are being made because of the setting up of the new Traffic Engineering Department.

Sec. 29. Public-Works-Public Service Engineer. Changes one Clerk III to one Clerk IV on recommendation of the new Public Service Engineer.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF FIVE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-SIX (\$5,796) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR CITY COLLECTOR - ITEM 0. (In City Council March 3, 1949. Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance).

To pay the salaries of the persons transferred from the Parking Meter Division, Item 0 to City Collector, Item 0, the

sum of \$5,796.00 is appropriated and this sum is obtained by transferring a like amount from Police Department, Parking Meter Division, Item 0, to City Collector, Item 0.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF SIX THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FOUR DOLLARS AND SEVENTY-SEVEN CENTS (\$6,904.77) TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT - ITEM 0. (In City Council March 3, 1949. Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance.)


This Ordinance transfers \$3,447.89 from Parking Meter Division, Item 0 and \$3,456.88 from Police Department, Item 0 to Traffic Engineering Department, Item 0 to pay the salaries of persons transferred from Police Department and Parking Meter Division to Traffic Engineering Department.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 128, BY ADDING THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY-SEVEN DOLLARS AND NINETY-TWO CENTS (\$2,887.92) TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT - ITEM 0. (In City Council March 3, 1949. Read and passed the first time, referred to Committee on Finance.)

The sum of \$2,887.92 is transferred from Police Department, Item 0 to Fire Department, Item 0 to pay the salaries of persons transferred from the Police to the Fire Department.

On motion of Mr. Laudati, seconded by Mr. Presel, it is voted to return the seven foregoing Ordinances to the City Council with recommendation of passage a second time.
